
## Virtual Side Event 17 May 2022, 8 - 9am (EDT)





Gender strongly influences human mobility in the context of climate change. Gender dynamics and inequality affect exposure and vulnerability to the impacts of climate change as much as they influence migration decisions and outcomes. At the same time, mobility can influence gender dynamics by both, entrenching traditional gender roles and challenging them.

This event will discuss and emphasize the overlooked interrelation between human mobility in the context of climate change and gender to promote concrete action for a gender-responsive implementation of the GCM. It will highlight existing gaps and present case studies, and good practices that illustrate the gender dimensions of climate and disaster-induced human mobility and propose innovative gender-responsive approaches to address them.
